To ensure that talented students can concentrate fully on their studies and gain their degree within a short period of time, the Mummert Scholarship offers a special financial package that also includes rewards for excellent examination results. Additionally, students are provided with a computer and printer, as well as academic and personal support and guidance from tutors at the universities and from the Foundation mentors.

Furthermore, the programme offers opportunities that extend far beyond the university studies:

- :: Traineeships in various German companies ensure that students acquire the necessary practical insight and understanding.
- :: Personal mentors make certain that the scholarship holders not only get to know university life but also gain a deeper insight into Germany and its culture, including family life.
- :: Skill seminars introduce modern management techniques to the scholarship holders.
- :: Colloquia bring the students together with leading representatives from the areas of politics, culture, education and research, as well as from business and industry.
- :: Regular meetings between scholarship holders and members of the Foundation provide an opportunity to discuss and agree on ways in which the scholars can play an active part in designing and implementing the Mummert Scholarship Programme, both for themselves as well as for the future generations of award holders.
- :: Last but not least, joint visits to cultural events round off the programme.

The Selection Process: Personality Counts

Are you studying economics, business administration or engineering? Are you in the last year of your Bachelor study, or have you already finished it? Do you come from one of the following countries:

Bulgaria, Estonia, Croatia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Montenegro, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Czech Republic or Hungary?

If you are no older than 24 years of age, speak very good German and have excellent academic qualifications, then you meet some of the key requirements for a Mummert Scholarship. However, your personality is the decisive factor.

We expect that you are already able to demonstrate that you have what it takes to be a leader. That means executive qualities, but it also means a high degree of social responsibility. These special qualifications often only appear at second sight. For this reason, we organise in-depth selection interviews in Germany, where, over several days, you meet with representatives of the host universities and of the Mummert Foundation. If you have already passed the pre-selection process in your home country, then you stand a good chance of being invited to the next round of the selection process in Germany.

Excellence for the New Europe

It starts with a vision: An economically powerful, politically stable and free Europe, shaped by the well-being and prosperity of all EU Member States. A community in which talented and motivated young people are willing to assume responsibility for the economic and political development of their countries.

The Rochus and Beatrice Mummert Foundation

promotes such talents by awarding scholarships to current students of economics, business administration, or engineering from Central and South Eastern Europe who have the potential to become top executives. They use these scholarships at a leading German university, having an exactly defined goal. After graduation, the scholarship holders are expected to return to their home countries and, in leadership positions, to contribute to their country's sustained development within the EU. This may be at the head of a company, in public administration or a governmental bureau, or at a university; wherever people with high potential are in demand.

In awarding these scholarships, the Foundation aims to support Central and South Eastern Europe in its efforts to help the economy develop its potential, thereby contributing to lasting political stability in Europe and to closer cultural and economic relations between Germany and the scholarship holders' home countries.

The University of Cologne and the Aachen University of Technology

The Mummert Foundation scholarships cover two years of study at the Master degree level at either the Aachen University of Technology or the University of Cologne. Both universities are located in major German cities with a wealth of tradition – Aachen, the City of Charlemagne, and Cologne, the Cathedral City. Both universities rank among Germany's and the world's most renowned institutions. The range of studies and lectures offered by these two universities is unparalleled, with teaching and research represented by outstanding academics and scientists. It is no surprise that admittance to these universities is highly sought-after and that their graduates are in great demand in the fields of business and

industry, public administration and government, and at universities, both at home and abroad.

The scholarships are offered in cooperation with the Robert Bosch Stiftung, one of the major German foundations. The scholarships are available every year, with studies beginning in the winter semester of the following year.

The Value of Studying in Germany

Studying in Germany means studying in the heart of Europe, in a country whose geographical position alone guarantees intense exchange with its neighbouring countries. Collaboration with universities worldwide and the chance to interact with students from all over the world who are also studying in Germany open up new and often surprising perspectives and prospects. In the future, successful top-flight executives will, more than ever before, need to have an outstanding university training combined with practical experience, multi-disciplinary knowledge, an international profile, and a personal sense of responsibility. The Mummert Foundation is convinced that studying at a leading German university makes a unique contribution to the strengthening and advancement of such skills, abilities, and excellence.

Last but not least, studying in Germany means studying in a country that belongs to the home country's most important economic partners.
